During the WSF 2005 held in Porto Allegre, the Senegalese artist Coumba Toure sang a song telling the story of a cage imprisoning birds that should be destroyed rather than buying a single bird's freedom for 50 cents, as people seeking luck do in the streets of Dakar.

This beautiful moment, as Trevor Ngwane recalls in one of his essays on the WSF, was possible due to the resources of NGOs and funding organizations, promoting their own visions but also seeking to create a platform for the struggles of social movements and other mass organisations.

The African Social Forum's founding principles indeed

recognise the primacy of social movements over NGOs in the struggle against neo-liberalism as mentioned by Ngwane in his essay.

As the five-day conclave of anti-globalisation forces in India came to an end, our delegation was honored by being given the space to close the event with the beats of African drums before thousands of activists from South and South East Asia, China and our Continent. For us, this collaboration served as the building block for future African-Asian collaboration.

If your organization want to register activities to the Nairobi event you are not familiar with the internet, you can download the activity registration form from

<http://www.wsf2007.org/register>.

This form must be e-mailed to registration@wsf2007.org

After Registering yourself in the WSF Common Space you will have to register your organisation, or simply ask to be included if you're already registered as such. Then you may register your activity for the WSF Nairobi 2007 event. You can browse or search for other organisations or groups

of organisations. In those groups, participants cooperate in the name of their respective organizations and may collectively submit proposals for social change or register activities, either specific to the WSF Nairobi 2007 event, or of a general scope.

You can join existing groups by cooperation or register new ones. You can contact participants of any organisation or group by using the contact participants form in the workspace of the organisation or group.

You can work collaboratively on documents with the rest of your organisation/group members. You can make them visible to all site participants or keep them restricted to mem-

bers of your organisation/group. Documents, images, links and other files may exist under your organisation's/group's workspace or they can be specific to a registered activity or proposal and reside under it. Browse the activities, proposals and public documents that have been submitted by other organisations or groups.

The Secretariat in Nairobi is making efforts to establish a team of "internet mediators" that will link the organizations without internet and those in the workspace.
